



OVERNIGHT PARKING PERMITS

A City of Waupaca ordinance requires anyone parking in the public parking lots between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. to purchase a parking permit. The permits are available for purchase starting September 21st for the period ending September 30th of the following year. The cost of the permit is \$120.00 for the year. Please stop at City Hall, located at 111 S. Main St., Waupaca, to fill out the application & obtain the parking permit. For more information please call (715) 258-4411.

PUBLIC FIRE PROTECTION

The Public Fire Protection charge recovers the cost of water for fighting fires and the extra capacity built into the system necessary to rapidly deliver a large volume of water to a fire anywhere within the Waupaca's water service area. These costs include a portion of the wells, pumps, storage facilities, water mains, hydrants and an estimated quantity of water used for this purpose. This charge is applied to all parcels in the City of Waupaca.

WAUPACA UTILITY ANNUAL FLUSHING PROGRAM

The Waupaca Water Utility's Annual Flushing Program will be done during the week of September 20 – 25, 2020 during the hours of 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., and September 28 – October 2, 2020 during the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. This flushing of the water mains will remove most of the natural minerals such as iron that are harmless, but will discolor the water. If you see our staff working in your area, use as little or, if possible, no water for one-half to three quarters of an hour to insure that the water has settled down and that the discoloration is not drawn into your home's water system. Should you find discoloration, stop using water, wait one-half to three quarters of an hour, then draw off the discolored water through the cold water only.

Your help and cooperation in this program will benefit all water consumers.


Consider Hosting a RYE Student


Just a reminder, with the school year starting be aware and use caution when approaching stopped buses with flashing lights. Please see diagram below.



TWO-LANE:
Vehicles traveling in both directions **MUST** stop.



MULTI-LANE PAVED ACROSS:
Vehicles traveling in both directions **MUST** stop.



DIVIDED HIGHWAY:
(Unpaved space (Min. 5ft.) OR any raised median or physical barrier.)
Vehicles behind bus **MUST** stop.
Vehicles traveling in the opposite direction proceed with caution.
