The City of Waupaca is planning to provide garbage and recycling pickup starting in 2022. The plan would be to contract with one of the private regional waste haulers to provide weekly garbage and bi-monthly recycling pickups. This service will be provided for each single-family resident along with multifamily up to 4 units. Garbage pickup will occur weekly, recycling pickup every-other week. The monthly service cost will be included on water/sewer bills, which is expected to be \$10 or less per month. The WRRCC will continue to operate as is and open for City residents as usual. ATTENTION

The Street Department is no longer picking up brush and leaves from the terrace area. This service ended in April 2021. PLEASE HELP US CONTROL NOXIOUS WEEDS AND UNCUT GRASS

Chapter 10.03 of the Waupaca Code of Ordinances requires property owners in the City to keep up their lots by controlling and cutting noxious weeds and high, uncut grass. Noxious weeds in our area typically are Canada Thistle, Leafy Spurge and Field Bindweed (Creeping Jenny). All **grass over 12" in height must be cut.**

The City Building and Zoning Department, (715)942.9914, is charged with enforcing this ordinance. The process they will use consists of placing a red door hanger on your house or business entrance. This hanger is a WARNING only and tells you that the city is monitoring your property. Owners of Vacant property will be notified by mail. We typically give the owner about 7 days to correct the situation. If the property owner does not take care of it, then the City will cut the grass or will hire a private contractor to do the work. The owner will be billed based on our costs, plus an additional administrative charge. If the bill is not paid in a timely manner the charge will be placed on the tax bill as a lien against the property. Please do your part in helping us keep our City looking great. Thank you.

Summer Water Conservation Tips – Because less water used, is a smaller bill.

- Marry the weather with your landscape water use. Water use should decrease during rainy periods
- Consider buying a dual-flush toilet. It has two flush options: a half-flush for liquid waste and a full-flush for solid waste.
- Apply water only as fast as the soil can absorb it. Try watering in half-hour increments and check in-between watering to see if more is needed.
- Adjust your lawn mower height. Taller grass shades roots and holds soil moisture better than short grass.
- Pruning properly can help your plants use water more efficiently.
- Use 2 to 4 inches of organic mulch around trees and plants to reduce evaporation and save hundreds of gallons of water a year.
- Direct water from rain gutters and HVAC systems to water-loving plants in your landscape.
- When cleaning out fish tanks, give the nutrient-rich water to your non-edible plants.
