




OVERNIGHT PARKING PERMITS

A City of Waupaca ordinance requires anyone parking in the public parking lots between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. to purchase a parking permit. The permits are available for purchase starting September 21st for the period ending September 30th of the following year. The cost of the permit is \$120.00 for the year. Please stop at City Hall, located at 111 S. Main St., Waupaca, to fill out the application & obtain the parking permit. For more information please call (715) 258-4411.



WAUPACA UTILITY ANNUAL FLUSHING PROGRAM

The Waupaca Water Utility's Annual Flushing Program will be done during the week of September 19 – 24, 2021 during the hours of 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., and September 27 – October 1, 2021 during the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. This flushing of the water mains will remove most of the natural minerals such as iron that are harmless, but will discolor the water. If you see our staff working in your area, use as little or, if possible, no water for one-half to three quarters of an hour to insure that the water has settled down and that the discoloration is not drawn into your home's water system. Should you find discoloration, stop using water, wait one-half to three quarters of an hour, then draw off the discolored water through the cold water only.

Your help and cooperation in this program will benefit all water consumers.

PUBLIC FIRE PROTECTION

The Public Fire Protection charge recovers the cost of water for fighting fires and the extra capacity built into the system necessary to rapidly deliver a large volume of water to a fire anywhere within the Waupaca's water service area. These costs include a portion of the wells, pumps, storage facilities, water mains, hydrants and an estimated quantity of water used for this purpose. This charge is applied to all parcels in the City of Waupaca.

EXPANDED ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE TO HOUSEHOLDS IMPACTED BY COVID-19
CAP Services is administering grant programs for individuals whose income or resources were impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Residents in Waupaca, Waushara, Marquette, Outagamie and Portage counties can call 844-314-8004 for information in English, Spanish or Hmong.

Renters:

Assistance is available through the Wisconsin Emergency Rental Assistance (WERA) program. Applicants must have household income at or below 80% of the county median income. Households can receive up to 12 months of rental arrearages and/or rental assistance, plus an additional 3 months if the extra months are determined to be needed to ensure housing stability and funds are available. Utility and housing energy payments and arrearages are also available.

Homeowners:

Assistance is available through CDBG-CV for residents of Marquette, Portage, Waupaca, or Waushara counties. Applicants must have household income at or below 80% of the county median income. Households can receive up to \$5,000 in assistance covering mortgage arrearages and payments and utility expenses over a period of 6 months.

Other Needs:

Small grants (up to \$500) are available to households with income at or below 125% of the federal poverty level. Grants are available for housing and utility expenses that are not covered by WERA or CDBG-CV assistance programs, and for other household expenses such as child care, food, transportation, technology, or medical/health care costs. CAP's emergency grants are open to all residents of our service area regardless of citizenship or immigration status.
