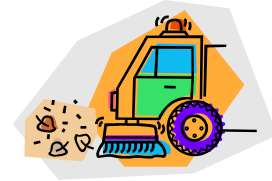
2021 Fall Leaf Pickup Schedule

The following schedule has been setup to provide fall leaf pickup for residents of the City of Waupaca:

Ward 4 & 6	Week of October 17th
Ward 2 & 7	Week of October 24th
Ward 3 & 9 & 11	Week of October 31st
Ward 1 & 8	Week of November 7th
Ward 5 & 10	Week of November 14th

After this schedule is done we will start from the beginning again and go thru the City in the same order, until done. Please comply with the following requirements:

- **DO NOT** include sticks, twigs or branches
- **DO NOT** bag your leaves
- **KEEP LEAVES IN TERRACE AREAS OR ON GRASSY AREAS. NOT IN THE ROADWAY.**
- Absolutely **NO BRUSH** of **ANY SORT**



Please have your leaves on the curb or edge of yard on or before the Monday morning of your respective week. Crews will begin early in the morning creating some noise. To learn which ward you are in, visit our website at www.cityofwaupaca.org.

The City of Waupaca will provide garbage and recycling pickup starting in 2022. The service will be provided by Graichen Disposal & Recycling LLC. Graichen will be dropping off 2 carts before the end of the year for each residential unit in the City. Of the 2 carts, 1 cart will be for weekly garbage pickup and 1 cart will be for every-other week recycling pickup. The charge for this service will show up on your water/sewer utility bill as refuse and recycling charge of \$13.92. If you currently use Graichen, you will stop receiving bills from them as of January 2022. If you have service through someone else, you should call them and ensure billing and service stop as of January 2022. All the regional haulers have been notified by the City of Waupaca of the change in service.

OVERNIGHT PARKING PERMITS

City of Waupaca ordinance requires anyone parking in the public parking lots between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. to purchase a parking permit. The permits are valid for one year, starting October 1 and ending September 30th of the following year. The cost of the permit is \$120.00 for the year. Please stop at City Hall, located at 111 S. Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

The Wisconsin Department of Administration (DOA), Division of Energy Housing and Community Resources (DEHCR), is introducing the Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP). LIHWAP is designed to provide direct financial assistance to reduce arrearages charged to eligible drinking water and wastewater utility customers.

The LIHWAP was authorized under two separate federal appropriations as part of an emergency effort to respond to the possible future disconnection of water services due to impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. Financial assistance for water and wastewater bills is provided for in the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The focus of the program will be restoration of services and prevention of disconnection.

Households eligible for LIHWAP will be required to first complete a Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program (WHEAP) application. The federal Health and Human Services agency recently approved Wisconsin's implementation plan. Energy Services Inc. (ESI) is the agency responsible for administration of LIHWAP benefits in the State of Wisconsin, and the agency expects disbursements for water bill assistance to begin in September 2021. ESI will disburse an amount on a one-time basis to the utility, which will be responsible for applying the assistance to an eligible customer's bill.
