You will need to bring updated rabies information and also proof that your pet was spayed or neutered since the last time you purchased your license. ADOPT A FIRE HYDRANT

This snow-covered fire hydrant needs your attention. If your property is in the vicinity of a fire hydrant, the Waupaca Water Utility would appreciate it if you would adopt the fire hydrant and shovel the snow away from it. Please shovel a 3 foot area around the hydrant. It is important to keep the snow and ice removed so the Fire Department can locate and access the fire hydrant in case of an emergency.

The City of Waupaca and Waupaca Water Utility thank you for your cooperation.



Please check areas near water meters and connecting piping to protect from freezing. The average cost to repair a frozen water meter is \$30.00.

SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL RESPONSIBILITIES

In the event where snow accumulates in Waupaca, residents are responsible to remove snow and clean sidewalks **within 24 hours after any snow fall**. Landlords and tenants should establish who will be responsible for snow/ice removal in their rental agreement. It is also required to use material (sand, salt, or mixture) to reduce the risk of slipping and falling for pedestrians on said sidewalks. Failure to remove snow and ice shall be deemed a public nuisance per municipal code 10.05 (13). Snow removed from sidewalks or driveways must **NOT** be shoveled onto roadways or neighboring properties.

Please do your part to ensure that our sidewalks are safe. (And if you have a neighbor who needs help shoveling, consider lending a hand.) If you contract snow removal, be sure your contractor is aware of city policies and ordinances. The city asks for your diligence in snow removal. For more information, please see the Municipal Code Section 8.09 for the City of Waupaca or contact Code Enforcement at 715-942-9914.

The minimum fee of \$150 will be charged to the property owner for snow removal if completed by the City. Repeat offenses in the same season may result in an increased fee being charged.

City Refuse & Recycling

The City of Waupaca Common Council reviewed and acted on Resolution 1531 (2022) at its regular meeting time of 6:00pm on December 6, 2022. The adopted Resolution 1531 will update garbage and recycling pick up service rates for the calendar year 2023. Per agreement with GFL Environmental Inc. the rates are as follows:

\$14.43 for refuse and recycling services per residential unit.

\$10.20 monthly for each additional refuse tote

\$4.24 monthly for each additional recycling tote

Fuel surcharge when the cost of ultra-low sulfur No. 2 Diesel Fuel, raises above \$4.00 per gallon. For every \$0.25 rise in fuel, the cost of services will increase by 1%.

CITY OF WAUPACA MERCURY POLLUTION MINIMIZATION PROGRAM

In an effort to minimize the health and environmental impacts of mercury in our community, an ongoing take-back program is being conducted at City Hall in Waupaca. The City of Waupaca will accept mercury thermometers, fluorescent lamps/bulbs, Compact Fluorescent Lights (CFL's) and mercury-containing thermostats at no charge. Drop-offs will be accepted during normal business hours at Waupaca City Hall Front Desk, 111 S Main St, Waupaca.

Woolsey Plumbing & Heating, N2852 Cty Rd QQ, Waupaca is also accepting mercury containing thermostats during normal business hours.
